POPULATION: Women, men, HIV-positive, patients, people who inject drugs (PWID)

**RESPONSE OPTIONS:** Number of doses missed.

**SCORING:** Adherence calculated as 1 - (number of doses missed for the day/number of doses prescribed), expressed as percentage.

**SURVEY ITEMS:** The questionnaire queried the patient on the number of doses missed of an ARV drug over each of the four days prior to the study visit.

**RELIABILITY INFORMATION:** No reliability information reported.

**VALIDITY INFORMATION:** Criterion-related validity assessed via comparison with viral load.
