RESPONSE OPTIONS: 5-point Likert-type scale ranging from 1 = not at all confident to 5 = very confident.

SURVEY ITEMS:

General contraceptive use:

1. How confident are you that you would use contraception when a method of birth control is not right on hand?
2. How confident are you that you would use contraception when you have been using alcohol or other drugs?
3. How confident are you that you would use contraception when your partner gets upset about it?
4. How confident are you that you would use contraception when you (or your partner) feel side effects?
5. How confident are you that you would use contraception when it is too much trouble?

Condom-main

1. How confident are you that you would use a condom when you have been using alcohol or other drugs?
2. How confident are you that you would use a condom when you are sexually aroused?
3. How confident are you that you would use a condom when you think your partner might get angry?
4. How confident are you that you would use a condom when you are already using another method of birth control?
5. How confident are you that you would use a condom when you want your partner to know you are committed to your relationship?
