**RESPONSE OPTIONS:** 5-point scale: 5 = very sure she could; 4 = somewhat sure she could; 3 = don't know/not sure; 2 = somewhat sure she couldn't; and 1 = very sure she couldn't.

## **SURVEY ITEMS:**

Scale item: 'How confident are you that you could use...'

Birth control use

- 1. If you didn't have it with you
- 2. If you had been using alcohol or drugs
- 3. If your partner got angry about it

Condom use with main partner

- 1. If you had been using alcohol or drugs
- 2. If you were really turned on
- 3. If your partner might get angry or upset

Condom use with other partners

- 1. If you had been using alcohol or drugs
- 2. If you were really turned on
- 3. If you didn't have condoms with you
- 4. If the man might get angry or upset
