RESPONSE OPTIONS: Very poor, poor, fair, good, very good, excellent

SCORING: Any level less than excellent = nonadherent

SURVEY ITEMS: "How would you rate your adherence over the last month? (Circle one)."

RELIABILITY INFORMATION: No reliability information reported.

VALIDITY INFORMATION: Criterion-related validity assessed via comparison with viral load.
