RELIABILITY INFORMATION: No reliability information was reported.

VALIDITY INFORMATION: Content validity was assessed. Convergent validity was assessed via comparison with Antiretroviral Adherence Study questionnaire, psychological distress items, and coping items. Confirmatory factor analysis was performed and there are two factors that make up the SNAR index
